


Program Costs

- Startup cost: ~\$19,500 for 58 dispensers and initial stock
- Ongoing supply cost: ~\$145,000
 - 443,000 tampons and pads ordered
 - Average monthly cost: \$5,399

Lessons Learned

- Throughout the COVID-19
 pandemic, some facilities were not fully open to public
- Reordering is not yet consistent
- More pads than tampons reordered



Expansion Plan

- 1,197 additional dispensers in 343 facilities by May 2024
- Dispensers in all female, all gender-neutral, and 1 male restroom in all County facilities
- Expansion installations began in November 2023. As of 12/28/23:
 - 5.5% of dispensers & 230 cases of products purchased
 - 20% of dispensers installed
 - 20% owned buildings completed
 - 6% leased buildings completed
