2015 LOVE YOUR HEART REPORT

Over 20,000 Blood Pressure Screenings Performed on Fourth Annual Love Your Heart Day

Love Your Heart is an annual, one-day event during which the County of San Diego and its partners provide free blood pressure screenings to the public at select sites throughout the San Diego

region. The goal of Love Your Heart is to activate people to "know their numbers" and take charge of their own heart health. An effort that started with the County in 2011, the event has since grown to include a broad group of partners in every sector including healthcare, libraries, the fire community, universities, city government, non-profits, and businesses. This truly unique event is a centerpiece of the County's regional wellness strategy — *Live Well San Diego* — which seeks to support residents live healthy, safe and thriving lives through the collective efforts of the entire community.

This year's Love Your Heart event took place on February 13, 2015. The event was a resounding success, with dozens of partners coming together to raise heart health awareness and activate San Diegans to "know their numbers." This year, Love Your Heart also went international, with over 30 sites in Mexico. Together, Love Your Heart partners performed over 20,400 blood pressure screenings on February 13th.

This report highlights key findings from Love Your Heart 2015. This data will be used to inform future efforts related to heart disease in the region. We are deeply appreciative of










our partners' collaboration in making this event, and report, possible.







Love Your Heart 2015 Sites






Love Your Heart 2015 By The Numbers

- ▼ 20,494 blood pressure screenings were performed at over 150 sites across 84 organizations.
- ♥ Of these, **80** individuals were identified as having urgent or emergent hypertension requiring immediate medical referral.
- 71.3% (14,613) of these screenings had a reported blood pressure level.
- 1 out of every 2 individuals with a reported blood pressure level was identified as having an elevated blood pressure.
- Of those with a reported gender, two-thirds of the participants were women.

Among participants with a reported gender and identified as having hypertension, 40.6% were male. A larger proportion of participants with hypertension were male compared to the total participants overall.





Percent of Screenings by Blood Pressure Level per Site Location, San Diego County Love Your Heart 2015




- Among the sites with a known location, sites in Central Region had the highest percent of participants determined to have normal blood pressure (46.8%).
- Sites in North Central and North Coastal had the highest percent of participants with an elevated blood pressure level, with 60.6% and 59.9% respectively.

N= 14,613 screenings with a reported blood pressure level

- Sites in the communities of Lemon Grove, Santee, Spring Valley, Coastal, Vista, Poway, and Ramona all had more than half of their participants with normal blood pressure.
- Sites in four communities found more than two-thirds of their participants to have hypertension. These were Harbison Crest, Lakeside, Carlsbad, and National City.




- Of the participants with a reported location of residence (3,236), Chula Vista was most commonly reported as the location of residence, however participants lived throughout all areas of the county.
- Of these participants who also had a reported blood pressure level, 48.6% had an elevated blood pressure level. Harbison Crest had the lowest percent of residents with an elevated blood pressure (33.3%), while Del Mar-Mira Mesa had the highest percent (65.0%).



Particiant's Residence by Health and Human Services Agency Region and Sub-Regional Area

N=3,394 screenings with reported blood pressure level and location of residence. *Less than 5 participants residing in sub-regoinal area

- Of the participants with a reported location of residence (3,236), six in ten had their blood pressure screening done in a different sub-regional area from where they live.
- More residents of South Bay received a screening in a different community than any other SRA (216). Of these residents, 168 received their screening in Chula Vista.
- There were 177 residents of Southeast San Diego who went to a different SRA for their screening. These residents went to areas such as Central San Diego, Mid City, Kearny Mesa, Chula Vista, and Lemon Grove.
