What is an Advisory Board?

- An advisory board is a group that works with an organization to provide guidance and make recommendations on strategy and policy.
- Advisory boards may also be known as a council, committee, commission, panel, or task force.

Why Join an Advisory Board?

- Fulfill a civic responsibility, help shape policy, and give back to your community.
- Meet people who share your interests.
- Donate your professional and personal skills.

- Most nonprofits welcome volunteers who are passionate about their mission, even if the volunteer doesn't have a background in the area.
- "Lay members" bring diverse life experiences and the perspective of a community member.

Three Steps to Join an Advisory Board and Serve Your Community

1. Identify Your Passion

 What are your interests: children, seniors, environment, animals, health, education, etc.?

2. Find an Organization

- Search for nonprofit organizations or government advisory boards working in your area of interest.
- Does the organization's mission statement align with your interests?

3. Get Involved!

- Attend an advisory board meeting.
- Start as a volunteer or join a committee.
- Apply to become an advisory board member.
